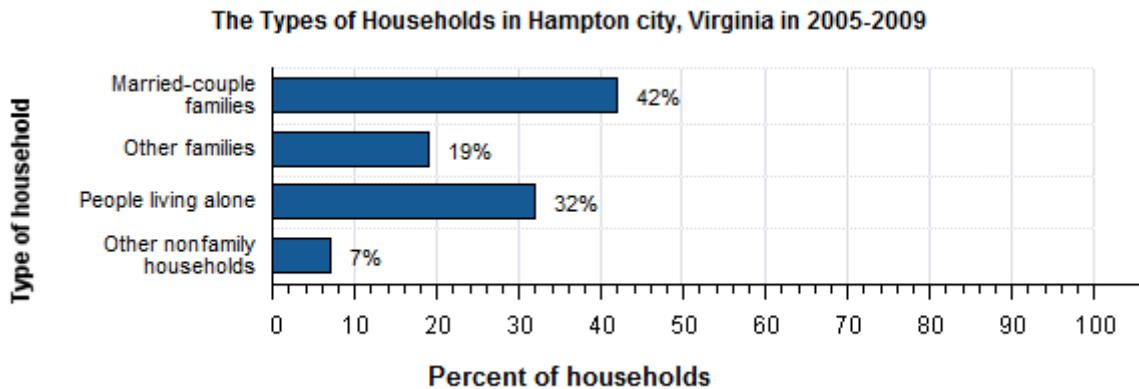
#### American Community Survey

NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

**HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES:** In 2005-2009 there were 55,000 households in Hampton city. The average household size was 2.6 people.

Families made up 61 percent of the households in Hampton city. This figure includes both married-couple families (42 percent) and other families (19 percent). Nonfamily households made up 39 percent of all households in Hampton city. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

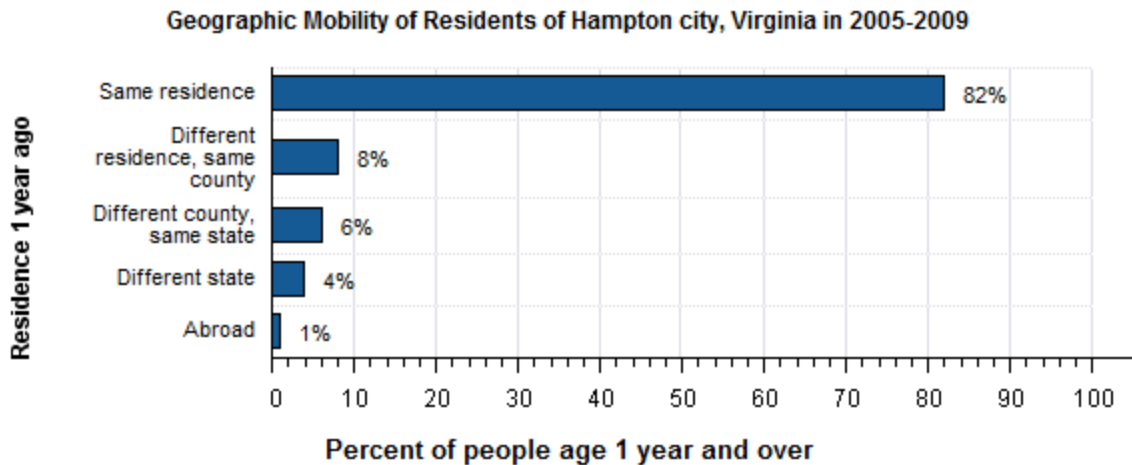

**NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE:** Five percent of the people living in Hampton city in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Ninety-five percent was native, including 49 percent who were born in Virginia.

Among people at least five years old living in Hampton city in 2005-2009, 7 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 38 percent spoke Spanish and 62 percent spoke some other language; 34 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

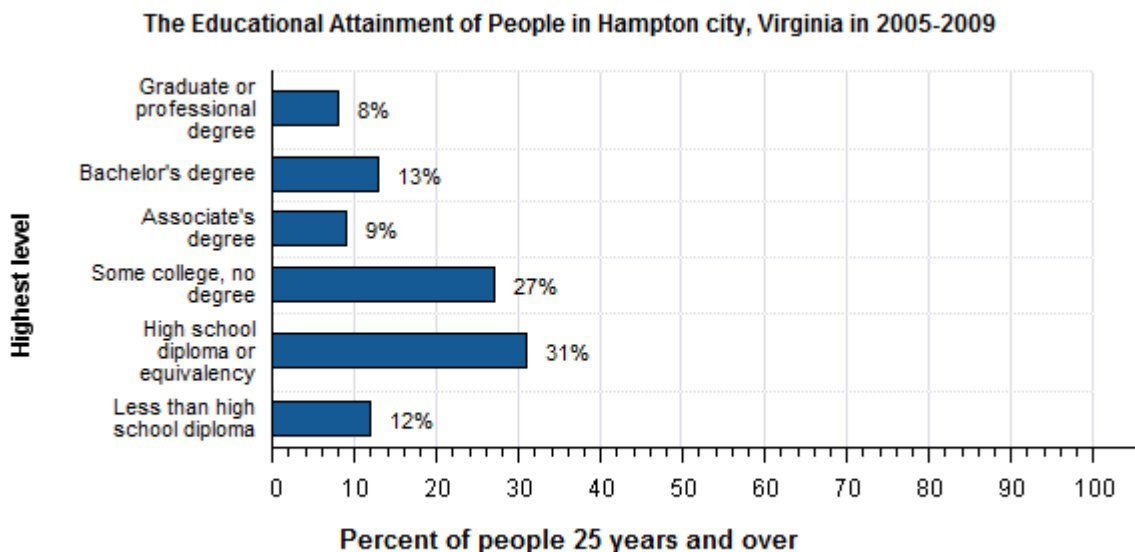
**GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY:** In 2005-2009, 82 percent of the people at least one year old living in Hampton city were living in the same residence one year earlier; 8 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 6 percent from another county in the same state, 4 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.

**EDUCATION:** In 2005-2009, 88 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 21 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Twelve percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

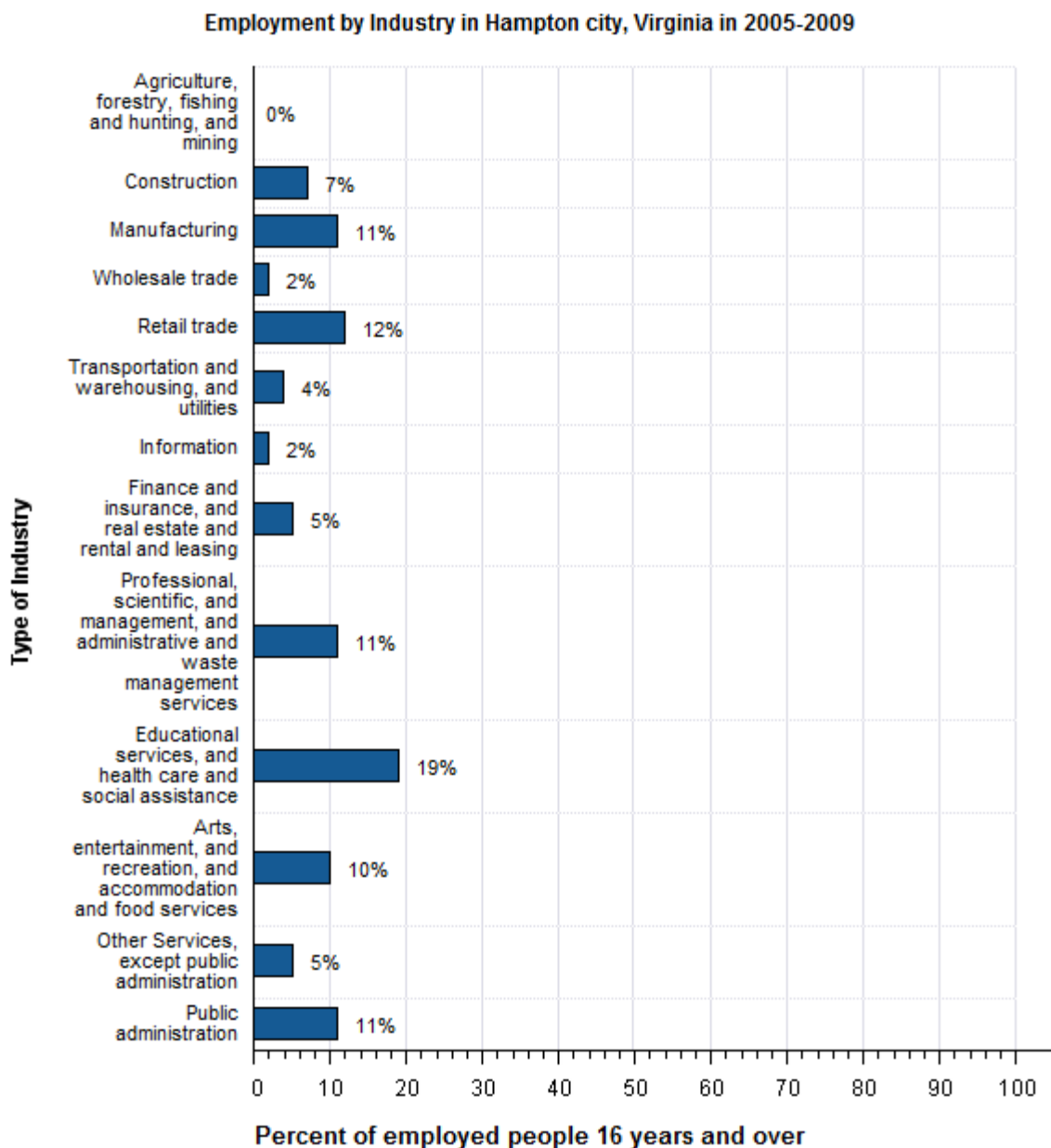
The total school enrollment in Hampton city was 41,000 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 3,700 and elementary or high school enrollment was 22,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 15,000.

**DISABILITY:** In Hampton city, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

**INDUSTRIES:** In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Hampton city were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 19 percent, and Retail trade, 12 percent.

**OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER:** Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 31 percent; Sales and office occupations, 26 percent; Service occupations, 17 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving

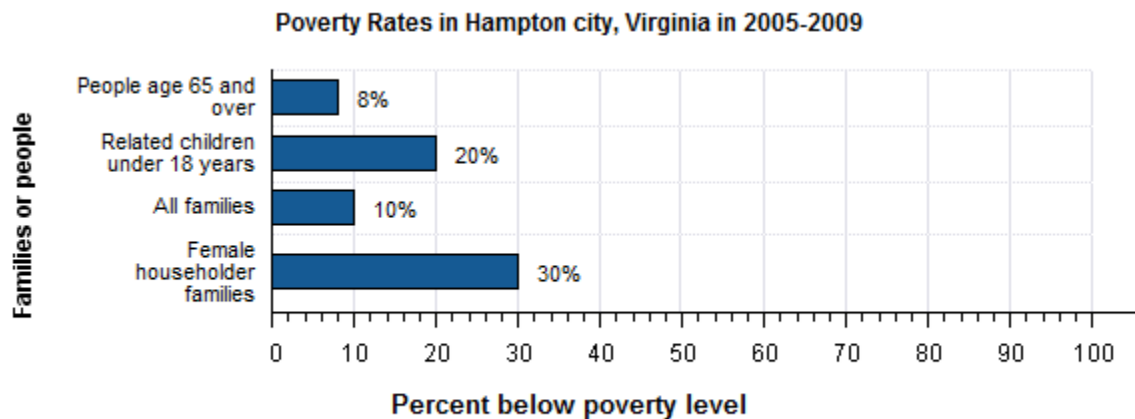

occupations, 14 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 12 percent. Seventy-one percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 25 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 4 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

**TRAVEL TO WORK:** Eighty-three percent of Hampton city workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 10 percent carpoled, 2 percent took public transportation, and 4 percent used other means. The remaining 2 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 22.3 minutes to get to work.

**INCOME:** The median income of households in Hampton city was \$48,122. Eighty-one percent of the households received earnings and 24 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-five percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$13,915. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

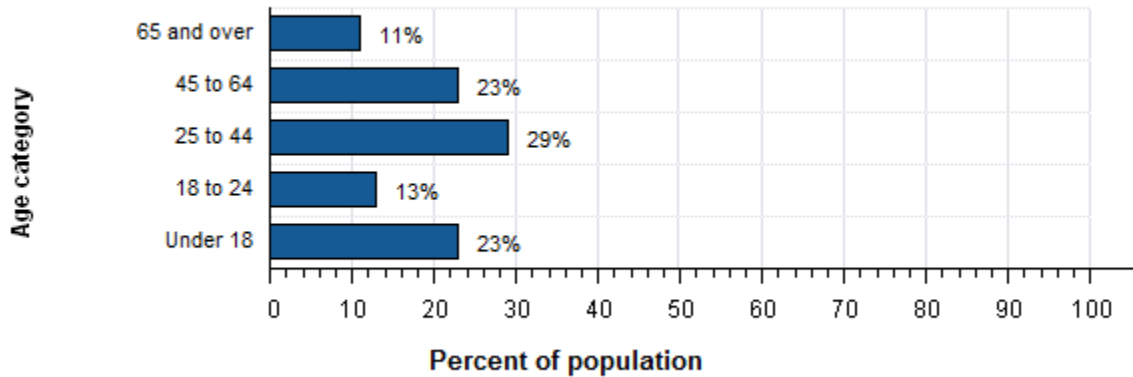
**POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS:** In 2005-2009, 13 percent of people were in poverty. Twenty percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 8 percent of people 65 years old and over. Ten percent of all families and 30 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

**POPULATION OF Hampton city:** In 2005-2009, Hampton city had a total population of 146,000 - 74,000 (51 percent) females and 72,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 34 years. Twenty-three percent of the population was under 18 years and 11 percent was 65 years and older.

**The Age Distribution of People in Hampton city, Virginia in 2005-2009**

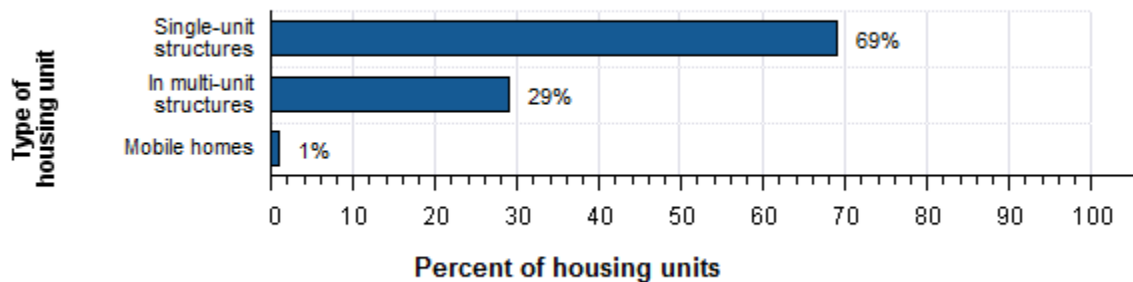

For people reporting one race alone, 47 percent was White; 47 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 2 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. Two percent reported Two or more races. Four percent of the people in Hampton city was Hispanic. Forty-five percent of the people in Hampton city was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

**HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS:** In 2005-2009, Hampton city had a total of 60,000 housing units, 9 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 69 percent was in single-unit structures, 29 percent was in multi-unit structures, and 1 percent was mobile homes. Seventeen percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

**The Types of Housing Units in Hampton city, Virginia in 2005-2009**

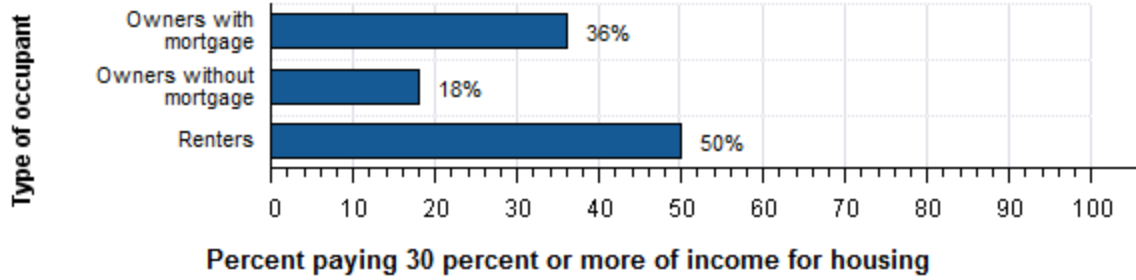

**OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS:** In 2005-2009, Hampton city had 55,000 occupied housing units - 32,000 (58 percent) owner occupied and 23,000 (42 percent) renter occupied. Four percent of the households did not have telephone service and 7 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-seven percent had two vehicles and another 21 percent had three or more.

**HOUSING COSTS:** The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,383, nonmortgaged owners \$435, and renters \$887. Thirty-six percent of owners with mortgages, 18 percent of owners without mortgages, and 50 percent of renters in Hampton city spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
